Palm Lakes Village Resident's Forum, January 14, 2016

Topics discussed:

<u>Beautification Program</u> - Diana Day gave a comprehensive report on the program starting with a recap of the various efforts (parking lot sale, Chat & Chew, donations, etc.) that have provided \$13,000.00 to use for this program. She gave credit to the many that helped to make this possible. She also commended the Design Committee that spent many hours discussing options for the use of this money at both the front and back gates, redoing the announcements board areas at both gates, and replacing trees that have been lost in our park. Her detailed report of their "pre-plans" showed the extensive care and thought that she, and her committee, have put into this so far.

Having laid out the general area to be worked on, she then stated that the project would require regrading, taking out or moving some plants and putting in others, changing some fascia and signage, and painting walls, guardhouse and possibly the gates. At this point she asked the audience to state what their expectations would be to accomplish this. Most felt it would take at least 3 to 9 months to complete.

She then gave her proposed schedule: The first step was getting the blessings of the PLV Board to contact Landscapers and begin the project. This has been done. Art Welch was instrumental in contacting Landscapers during the Christmas season. One company has already submitted a preliminary plan and two others are in the process. The companies have been asked to submit design renderings by Jan. 26th.

The PLV Annual Meeting is Thursday, Jan. 21st and the New Board will meet for their first Monthly Board Meeting on Thursday, Jan. 28th. The Board will be asked to approve all three designs so that whichever one the residents choose will be sanctioned by the Board. There will be a Resident's Meeting in January, so that each of the three companies can present their designs. The community will vote on Feb. 2nd. This election will be supervised by Martha Parrell and the Beautification Committee will not be involved. On Wednesday, Feb. 3nd, the winning design will be announced. On Feb. 4th the chosen Landscapers will begin construction. The companies have indicated that the project should be completed by Feb. 27th.

After her presentation, Diana opened the floor for questions:

Do we own the property outside our gates on which this work will be done? Yes.

Whichever company presents their design last would have the advantage of being able to add ideas presented by the others. The suggestion was made to have each company present their design separately without seeing the others.

Have you considered the vendors background? These are big, well-known companies and they will not be paid until the work is finished.

Will there be a traffic problem during construction? The committee will work with the company to keep closures at a minimum.

Will there be good lighting included in the designs? Grants have been submitted this year to provide lighting at our gates. Since this is a safety factor, it should be approved. This would provide a good sum of money beyond the \$13,000.00 to use specifically for lights. Unfortunately, this money is distributed in June, so the lighting will be done as a second stage in July or August. A company has been contacted and plans made. They have been assured that this installation will not disturb the landscaping.

Will the guardhouse be retained and can it be made to look like it is used? We will definitely keep it and it will be painted the secondary color used on the walls. Our plan is to use two neutral colors on the walls, plus colored granite stone to provide a variety of color without the high maintenance cost of flowers. The paint on the walls will go all the way north and south on 32nd St to the corner.

We will save money by having volunteers spray paint the walls. This is not a difficult job. About 6 or 8 people volunteered to help.

Since we are named PALM Lakes Village, will you be using Palms as well as cactus? Yes. We will use miniature palms that stay small and will be very visible for a long time.

Can you give us the company names that have been contacted? Sun Country (they seem most organized and have already provided preliminary plans), Green Goddess (which had no time until April or after, so they have been eliminated), Desert Classic, and Moon Valley (this company put in the palms around the Clubhouse Parking Lot.) Moon Valley has a new software program that shows a rendering of the actual look of the finished project, along with a picture of what it will look like in 5 and in 10 years.

Will the PLV lettering on the walls be changed? These are very well made and, while they may be moved, we hope to use them. The comment was made that these had been made years ago by a resident of PLV and they were glad they would be retained.

Beano said she had a huge cactus with many arms that she will donate if the Landscaper takes it out.

A resident mentioned that there are colored plants for arid regions that have seasonal changes in color but are very low maintenance. This could be another option for providing contrast.

A great round of applause was made for all the work Diana and her committee have done so far.

Letter from new HOA service - there was a lengthy discussion regarding the directions for getting Association Dues set up with the new company. Several were unsure what to do if they did not use a computer and wanted to establish SurePay. Tom is willing to help people if you come to the Office, but someone said you had to have an email address in order to set it up online. You can also mail a check voided on both sides to the First Service Office at 9000 E Pima Center Parkway, Suite 300, Scottsdale, AZ 85258. However, requests received after Jan. 15th (tomorrow) will not be processed for the Feb. payment. Some indicated they had not received the letter from First Service. We were assured that a payment not received for February will be billed along with the March bill and there will be no late fees if that is paid on time. It was suggested that you call our community manager, Silvia Vilbrandt, at 480-551-4523 or 480-551-4300. She is prepared to help you with any questions as we make this change. It was suggested that an article be prepared for the next newsletter giving all the information regarding making payments for February.

<u>Canceling payments to previous HOA</u> - If you had automatic payment of dues with the previous HOA, THEY will cancel this arrangement. You should not have to do anything at your bank to stop these payments. The HOA cannot collect dues without a signed contract with PLV.

<u>Meeting with new HOA</u> - Although no date has been set, it is planned to have the new HOA come out to the park for a meeting with the residents. In the meantime, Silvia Vilbrandt, our PLV manager, will be glad to help with any questions.

<u>Previous HOA has issued fines</u> – It was mentioned that the previous HOA has gone through the Park and has issued fines on violations. Residents were not sure how this will be handled.

It's a new year and some new beginnings in our community and we look forward to letting you know what is happening within PLV. It's also time to remind you about what can and cannot be placed in our newsletter and when articles are due for each edition. This newsletter is **yours** but there are rules that need to be followed.

Newsletter articles have a few simple rules that are to be followed and if you follow these rules your articles will be published without any problems.

First, no article will be accepted that complains about any issues or people who live in our community. If you have a problem with anything or anyone, take it to the Board of Directors.

Second, no articles will be accepted that advertise a business where the submitter receives monetary gain for the product(s) they are advertising. In other words, people who run a business out of their homes cannot advertise in the newsletter.

Third, no article may be written about a standing Board member period.

When submitting an article for publication, please verify al information; Spelling of names, dates and times. We publish what we are given. It is your responsibility to make sure the information provided is accurate. It is also important that when writing an article about or referencing a member of our community that we have that person's permission to print their name in the newsletter.

When submitting an article regarding a yard sale, patio sale or estate sale, ensure that you specify the date(s) and time(s) that your sale will be held. Also remember that you are required to get a permit from the office to hold these sales.

Finally, we do not accept any political advertising or promotion other than that is published for PLV elections to let the residents know about those who would like to serve on the Board of Directors.

There are deadlines for submitting articles for publication in the newsletter. Residents, clubs, committees and groups need to have their articles in to the editors by 6:00 pm on the Sunday before the newsletter is printed. The Board of Directors and Block Watch have until 12:00 pm on Monday preceding the issue of that week's newsletter. These deadlines will be adhered to strictly. No exceptions. We realize that things come up and exceptions may be required. When that happens we will review and decide the necessity for making exceptions.

Articles may be dropped off at our home at 16216 N. 35th Way (Lot #210) or at the office before it closes on Friday. If you drop it off at our home that almost guarantees we get it on time, but the deadlines still stand.

The monthly calendar is put together by the editors of the newsletter using the information provided by the Clubhouse Director. We print what we get from the Office.
